Please continue to view our web site for up to date changes. All accurate info is posted there and it is a dynamic calendar which captures all our changes, so verify activities on-line before assuming all is the same. There are a few advancement changes being incorporated this year which highlights how we will now track active participation for attending troop meetings and monthly unit activities. Generally during the month's tracking progress for each rank, troop meeting participation needs to be recorded at 75% and for unit outings at 50%. For example a Star scout must have active participation for four months so during the months selected by the scout he must show 75% attendance at meetings and 50% of the outings attended. Additionally all life scouts must use the new Eagle Workbook which is posted on our web site.

Sign up early because class size is limited and may be closed for late request. Cost is \$295 for scouts and \$150 for adults (\$30/day) plus additional fees as selected for certain events. Deposit of \$100 due Jan 30th, 2nd Payment of \$100 by Mar 26th & final \$95 by May 7th. A permission slip and physical are required for all scouts and scouters; need to be turned in by May 7th. TRAINED LEADERS- The Backbone of 629 (Reasons to Be Prepared)

Are you planning to get involved with scouts? Want to go on an overnight scout trip? Troop 629 always needs, welcomes and *loves* its volunteers. **If you want to participate in any of our activities we have a couple of pre-training requirements we need to have accomplished.** It's best to get your qualifications completed early so when that trip comes up that you want to go on; you aren't scrambling to get in.

All adults must complete the Youth Protection on line course before registration.

1. Complete **Adult Registration Form** (Found under *Forms* on Troop website, www.troop629.org, *Registration Form-Adult*)
2. Complete **Youth Protection & Fast Start** (found under *Training* on Troop website). Upon completion of any BSA training program, please email a copy of your course “completion” certificate to **Kathleen Narayanan** at kathleen@narayanan.us or bring a copy to her at the Troop meeting.

To participate as an adult leader in the troop on overnight camping, you must complete on line Youth Protection Training, Fast Start Training and review the Troop 629 Adult Guide. Assistant Scoutmasters and Committee Members must complete the above training **and** New Leaders Essentials, SALT, ITOLS and/or Committee Training. Information on these training opportunities is available on the Chattahoochee District Website at www.cdbsa.org

To participate in High Adventure, leaders must complete all the above along with special classes such as CPR, FA, safety afloat, and safe swim.
